

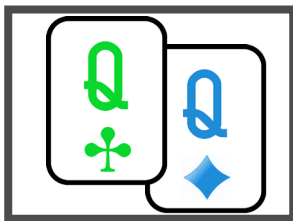

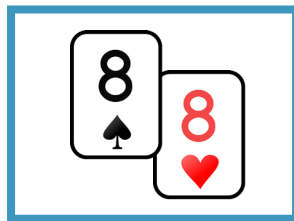
If No-limit is an art, then Limit is a science. Limit Hold'em is different from its more popular brother. In Limit you can not push out the draws with big all-in bets. You can not try for long shot draws hoping for a big pay off. What you can do is consistently make better decisions that win you a Big Bet here or save you a Small Bet there. When you bring your rack to the cage the bets you save are just as valuable as the ones you win.

Quick Tips

- Position matters: Late position makes one star hands playable if not raised yet.
- If you call a bet and get raised behind, usually call that three-bet.
- Flopped flush draws should be played aggressively, at least on the flop.
- Raising the flop often buys a free card on the turn when bets are bigger.
- If your pot equity is better than average, build a pot.
- Count the Big Bets in the pot, your odds are easier to calculate in Limit.
- Bluffing is nearly impossible, focus on value and good laydowns.
