

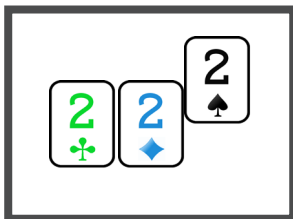


# STUD HIGH MIX GAME PRIMER

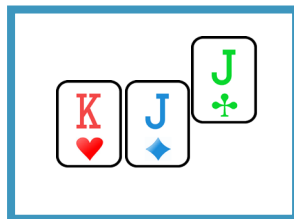
## HORSE

Stud high is a game in decline. Mostly popular in the 70's and 80's and heavily East Coast based. It is hard to find a good game of it anymore. Stud High tends to be the strongest game of the older generations in the HORSE game. Remembering which cards are live is very valuable. Good stud players will remember folded cards and profit well from that knowledge.

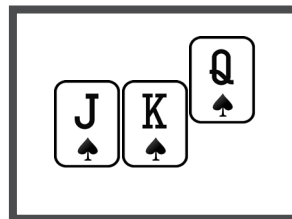
### Stud starting hand guide (Higher kickers help, hidden strength better, live outs better)



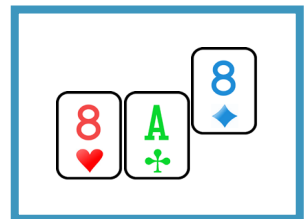
Rolled up trips ★★★★★



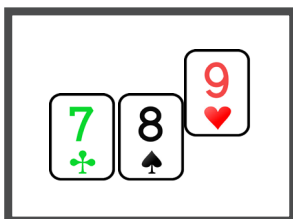
Big pairs ★★★★★



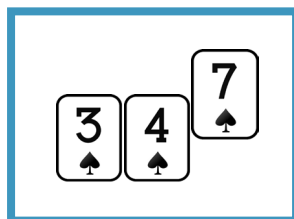
Suited connectors ★★★★★



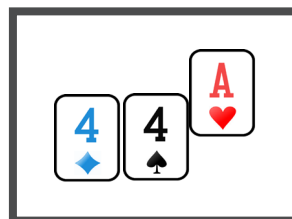
Medium pairs high kicker ★★



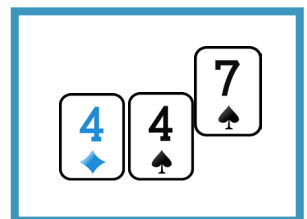
Three to a straight ★★

### Quick Tips

- Rigid starting requirements are important. Low ante structure allows for tightness.
- If you hear someone mention that you were drawing thin because all your outs were folded on third street- beware! This is a veteran player that is able to remember all the folded cards.
- Watch to make sure your outs are live.
- Look for loose-passive games with three or four players going to fourthstreet and beyond.
- If you are likely ahead with a big pair on third street, bet and raise.
- Bluffing is rare since the pot odds are always very good to call.
